

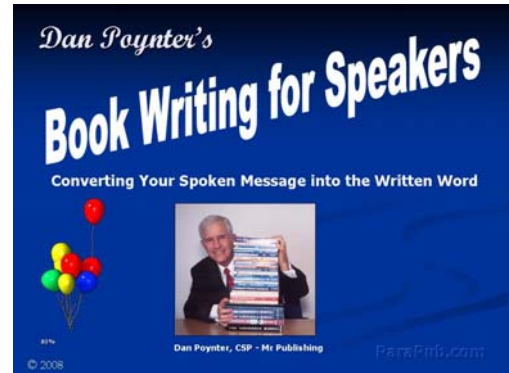


Dan Poynter presents
